

Bond County Community Unit #2 High School Graduation Requirements

In order to graduate, a student must have a minimum of 44 credits.

Minimum Credit Requirements for High School Graduation

Subject	Requirements
English	8 credits
Mathematics	6 credits (Algebra I required for Graduation)
Science	4 credits
Social Studies	4 credits (2 credits must be in American History and 1 credit must be in American Government)
Consumer Economics	1 credit from Business Concepts Or 1 credit from Resource and Business Management Or 2 credits from Ag Business Management Or 1 credit from Adult Living
Health	1 credit
Physical Education	6 credits
Fine Arts, Foreign Language or Vocational	2 credits

Credit Requirements for College Entrance

Subject	Requirements
English	8 credits
Mathematics	6 credits beginning with Algebra I
Science	6 credits in laboratory sciences
Social Studies	6 credits (2 credits must be in American History and 1 credit must be in American Government)
Fine Arts, Foreign Language or Vocational	4 credits

Since each college sets its own admission requirements, students should consult the websites of the colleges in which they are interested in attending in order to insure that they meet the requirements for those colleges. Students and parents should check with the guidance counselors to determine which courses students should take in order to meet the requirements for the college of their choice. Students must also realize that college admission requirements and acceptance dates are constantly changing and they must keep abreast of these changes.

Students planning to enroll in a community college transfer program before entering a public college or university must meet the same requirements as those entering directly into a four-year college or university. Students who do not meet these requirements but meet the other freshman admissions criteria may be admitted to enroll on a probationary basis in order to complete the required courses to fully qualify for regular admission.

All students planning to attend college after graduation should plan on taking the ACT/SAT test during the spring of their junior year. The state requires all Juniors to take the SAT in the spring, given during school. Colleges will accept the results of either the ACT or the SAT test.

Students are encouraged to begin the college exploration process early in their high school career. This includes campus visits to learn more about specific admission requirements at individual colleges.
